Beginner Lesson Ninety-one: Deborah & Barak

Overview Bible Facts & Songs: Songs about the Bible and the Judges

Bible Reading & Discussion: Judges 4:1-10, 12-16, 23; 5:1-5, 19-21, 31; Hebrews 13:32-34

Bible Memory & Craft: Questions about Salvation

<u>Learning Objectives:</u> (1) The people of Israel did evil in the sight of the Lord. (2) The Lord sold Israel to Canaan. (3) God used Barak to subdue Canaan. (4) Barak acted through faith. (5) Justification is the act of God counting a person righteous through the redemption of Jesus

Christ.

Opening Get students' attention by using a pre-planned silence signal.

Have students sit in rows or a semi-circle facing you. Open in prayer asking God's blessing upon the time.

Bible Facts Materials: Song visuals &/or props as needed

5-10 minutes Strategies: Sing It with Hand &/or Body Motions as appropriate

<u>Instructions</u>: Lead students to sing songs about the Bible & the Judges. Spend some time discussing the meaning of new songs. Encourage students to think about what they are singing.

Ask students to help lead songs, including actions and visuals as appropriate.

Bible Reading Materials: Bibles for students to use

15 minutes <u>Strategies</u>: Character Cues

Scripture: Judges 4:1-24; Hebrews 13:32-34

<u>Instructions</u>: Have students sit at tables. Leader reads expressively while students change position depending on who is speaking. The leader should prepare ahead by marking the passage according to who is speaking. To help students to follow who is speaking, leader should say "Name said" instead of reading a pronoun. Leader should pause often to give students time to

respond.

Deborah – girls stand Barak – boys stand

Bible Discussion Materials: Beanbag, word poster #1

10 minutes <u>Strategy</u>: Beanbag Toss

<u>Instructions</u>: Have students sit in a fellowship circle. The leader asks a question and then tosses a beanbag to someone who must either answer the question or toss the beanbag to someone else. When the question has been answered, the beanbag is tossed back to the leader.

Questions:

- After Ehud died, the people did *blank* in the sight of the Lord. (Evil)
- The Lord sold them into the hand of Jabin king of <u>blank</u>. (Canaan)
- ➤ How long were the people of Israel oppressed by Jabin? (20 years)
- > Deborah summoned Barak to obey God's command to gather 10,000 men at Mount Tabor. Barak said that he would only go if Deborah did what? (Went with him)
- Sisera was the commander of what? (Jabin's army)
- Deborah said, "Up! For this is the day in which the Lord has given Sisera into your hand. Does not the <u>blank</u> go out before you? (Lord)
- Who "routed Sisera and all his chariots and all his army?" (The Lord)
- According to Deborah's song, what happened to the earth, clouds, and mountains? (The earth trembled, the clouds dropped water, and the mountains quaked)
- What did the torrent Kishon do to the kings of Canaan? (Swept them away)
- According to Hebrews, it was through <u>blank</u> that Barak...put foreign armies to flight." (Faith)

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Show students the word poster and have them act out the words: God is...Creator, Omnipotent, Omniscient, Merciful, Righteous, Just, Creator of Nations, God is in control, Long-suffering, Glorious, Deliverer, Savior, All-seeing, Faithful, Judge, Provider, Prayer Answerer, Sovereign, Gracious, Way to Heaven, Protector, Promise Keeper, Success maker, King of kings, Holy, Law maker, Skill instiller, Guide, Victory giver, Truth, Rest provider

Ask students which words on poster #1 describe God in this lesson. (Answers: Omnipotent, In control, Victory giver, etc.)

Group Prayer

Through prayer, praise God for Who He is, listing His attributes.

Bible Memory 10-15 minutes <u>Transitional Thought</u>: In Hebrews, Barak is listed as one who acted "through faith." It is through

faith in Jesus Christ that sinners are justified (counted righteous). <u>Materials</u>: White board with markers and eraser

Strategy: Hand Motions

<u>Instructions</u>: Have students sit in a semi-circle or rows facing a white board with the following

passage written on it:

Question: What is justification?

Answer: Justification is the act of God counting a person righteous.

Verse: "for all have sinned...and are justified by his grace as a gift, through...Christ Jesus...to be

received by faith." Romans 3:23-25

Simple hand motions are chosen to represent most words in the passage. Students read the passage a few times using words and hand motions. Students then read the passage leaving out the words that have hand motions. Next students repeat the passage using hand motions and

words from memory, without looking at the words.

Bible CraftAs time allows

Materials: Red transparent plastic cups/cellophane/transparency..., red colored pencil, paper,

sample project

Activity: Magic hearts

<u>Instructions</u>: Have students sit at tables. Have each student cut a heart out of white paper. On the heart have student copy in red pencil, "All have sinned." Give each student red, transparent plastic. Have students look through the plastic at the heart. Do the words disappear? (They should if the pencil and the plastic are close enough to the same color.) Discuss "justification." God sees His children through the blood of Christ, counting them righteous.

Closing

Have students assist with clean-up.

Remind students to practice their memory work throughout the week.

Close in prayer & dismiss.
