Primary Lesson Sixteen: Isaac

Overview

Bible Facts: The books of the Bible Isaiah - Malachi

Bible Reading & Discussion: Genesis 17:1-8,15-21; 18:1-15; 21:1-2, Hebrews 11:11-12

Memorization & Art Activity: "A Baptist Catechism: A Catechism for Boys & Girls" Question #12

Opening

Get students' attention by using a pre-planned silence signal.
Have students sit in rows or a semi-circle facing you.
Open in prayer asking God's blessing upon the time.

Bible Facts
5-10 minutes

Materials: Bibles for students to use

Strategies: Sing It and Bible Drill Modified

Instructions: Sing the 5th verse of the "Books of the Old Testament" song. Have students hold their Bibles closed. Call out a name of one of the books Isaiah - Malachi. As soon as student has located the book in the Bible, have student stand until all students have found the book and are standing. Repeat the process until students have found many of the books Isaiah - Malachi.

Bible Reading
15 minutes

Materials: Bibles for students to use

Strategies: Paired or Small Group Reading

Scripture: Genesis 17:1-8,15-21; 18:1-15; 21:1-2, Hebrews 11:11-12

Instructions: Have students sit at tables. Students read brief passages aloud to one another in pairs or small groups. After each passage, the listening students summarize, and/or analyze characters.

Bible Discussion
10 minutes

Materials: Word poster: add "Faithful=Promise keeper"

Strategy: Order Please

Instructions: Have students sit in a fellowship circle. Students are ordered by height, birth date, length of hair, etc. Students share in this order.

Questions: God gave Abram a new name that means 'father of a multitude.' What was Abram's new name? (Abraham) God gave Sarai a new name that means 'princess.' What was Sarai's new name? (Sarah) What did Abraham do when God promised to give Sarah a son? (Fell on his face and laughed) What did Sarah do when she overheard that she would have a son? (Laughed to herself) Why did Abraham and Sarah laugh? (They were very old, too old to have a son naturally.) Did God keep His promise to give them a son? (Yes) God gave Abraham and Sarah's son a name that means 'he laughs.' What was his name? (Isaac) According to Hebrews, although Sarah laughed did she believe God? (Yes, she had faith.) Why did she have faith? ("...she considered him faithful who had promised.") What does it mean to be faithful? (Promise keeper, word is to be trusted, trustworthy) Abraham was seventy-five years old when God first called him. He was 100 years old when Isaac was born. How many years did Abraham and Sarah have to wait from the time they were called to the time they had Isaac? (25 years) What does this teach us? (Even if it seems like it is taking a long time God will keep His promises. God's word can be trusted. He is faithful.)

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Show students the word poster and have them act out the words: Creator (use hands to make a ball), Omnipotent (make a muscle), Omniscient (tap head), Life-source (blow air), Just (thumbs up), Merciful (make "safe on base" sign with two arms), Righteous (with right hand make circular motion), Life-sustainer (hold both hands out as though holding a ball), Creator of Nations (sweep arm from left to right), God is in control (salute with hand to head), Long-suffering (fold hands together as though waiting patiently), Glory (spread fingers of both hands like light rays), Providence (point finger as though directing) Deliverer (move wrists as though breaking rope), Savior (spread arms wide then draw together), All-seeing (put hand above eyes as though looking around), Faithful (shake hands with another person)

Group Prayer

Through prayer, praise God for Who He Is.

Bible Memory

10-15 minutes

Materials: White board with markers and eraser

Strategy: Hand Motions

Instructions: Have students sit in a semi-circle or rows facing a white board with the following written on it:

Question 12: "Does God know all things?"

Answer: "Yes. Nothing can be hidden from God."

Verse: "For the eyes of the Lord run to and fro throughout the whole earth..." 2 Chronicles 16:9

Simple hand motions are chosen to represent most words in the passage. Students read the passage a few times using words and hand motions. Students then read the passage leaving out the words that have hand motions. Next students repeat the passage using hand motions and words from memory, without looking at the words. Finally, students repeat the passage from memory using words only, without hand motions.

Bible Art Activity

As time allows

Materials: Construction paper, tape, markers, sample project

Activity: Telescope

Instructions: Have students sit at tables. Give each student a piece of construction paper. Show students how to roll the paper into a cone shape. One end should be narrow, a little larger than a person's eye. The other end should be wider. Tape the paper so that it maintains its shape. Have students decorate their telescopes and write on them, "Nothing can be hidden from God."

Closing

Have students assist with clean-up.

Remind students to practice their memory work throughout the week.

Close in prayer & dismiss.
