Primary Lesson One Hundred Thirty-four: The Ark of God

- Overview** Bible Facts & Songs: Bible Drill
Bible Reading & Discussion: Numbers 4:14-15; Deuteronomy 10:8; I Chronicles 13:1-14; 15:1-4, 11-16, 25-28
Bible Memory & Craft: The Armor of God
Learning Objectives: (1) During the time of Moses, the Lord set aside the Levites to serve Him. They were to carry the Ark of the Covenant with poles; they were not to touch it or any of the other holy items or they would die. (2) When David and the Israelites went to get the Ark of God, they put it on a cart pulled by oxen. (3) When the oxen stumbled, Uzzah touched the ark and died. (4) David left the ark at the home of Obed-edom for three months while he prepared a place for the ark. (5) When David and all Israel returned to get the ark, the Levites carried it on poles as the Lord had directed. (6) God helped the Levites who were carrying the ark. (7) All Israel brought up the ark with shouting and playing of instruments. (8) There is only one way of salvation. Only faith in Jesus Christ can save a person from eternal death.
- Opening** Get students' attention by using a pre-planned silence signal.
Have students sit in rows or a semi-circle facing you.
Open in prayer asking God's blessing upon the time.
- Bible Facts** Materials: Bibles for students to use
5-10 minutes Strategies: Bible Drill
Instructions: Students hold closed Bibles up over head. The leader then calls out a Scripture reference – the book, the chapter and the verse. When the leader says, "Charge," the students look for the reference in their Bibles. When the reference is found, students stand and read it.
- Bible Reading** Materials: Bibles for students to use
15 minutes Strategies: Missing Word Reading
Scripture: Number 4:14-15; Deuteronomy 10:8; I Chronicles 13:1-14; 15:1-4, 11-16, 25-28
Instructions: Have students sit at tables. Leader reads aloud expressively. Whenever leader pauses students say, "Levites." Leader should mark passage ahead of time.
- Bible Discussion** Materials: Beanbag
10 minutes Strategy: Beanbag Toss
Instructions: Have students sit in a fellowship circle. The leader asks a question and then tosses a beanbag to someone who must answer and then toss the beanbag back to the leader.
Questions:
- When the Israelites were in the wilderness, God gave Moses instructions about moving the tabernacle and its items. God said, "They must not touch the blank things, lest they die." (Holy)
 - What tribe of Israel did the Lord set apart to carry the Ark of the Covenant and to minister to the Lord? (The tribe of Levi)
 - When David and the Israelites first went to get the Ark of God, it was carried on what? (A cart)
 - The oxen pulling the cart stumbled, so Uzzah put out his hand and touched the ark. What happened to Uzzah? (He died)
 - David left the ark at the home of Obed-edom for how long? (Three months)
 - After David had prepared a place for the ark, he again prepared to move the ark. This time David said that "no one but the blank may carry the ark of God, for the Lord had chosen them to carry the ark of the Lord and to minister to him forever." (Levites)
 - David said to the Levites, "Because you did not carry it the first time, the Lord our God broke out against us, because we did not blank him according to the rule." (Seek)
 - The Levites carried the ark of God on their shoulders with the blank, as Moses had commanded according to the word of the Lord." (Poles)

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- Seven bulls and seven rams were sacrifice because “blank helped the Levites who were carrying the ark of the covenant of the Lord.” (God)
- All Israel brought up the ark of the covenant of the Lord with shouting and playing of instruments. What are some of the instruments that were played? (Horns, trumpets, cymbals, harps, and lyres)

Transitional Thought: There was only one way that the Ark of the Covenant was to be moved. It was to be carried on poles by Levites, who were set aside by God for the purpose of serving Him. David and the Israelites did not obey the Lord about the way that they moved the Ark of the Covenant, so Uzzah touched the Holy Ark of God and died. There is only one way that a person can be saved and go to heaven. The person must put his/her faith in Jesus Christ and His payment for sin on the cross. Any other way will result in eternal death rather than eternal life.

Group Prayer Through prayer, praise God for Who He is and for salvation through faith in Jesus Christ.

Bible Memory Materials: White board with markers and eraser

10-15 minutes Strategy: Hand Motions

Instructions: Have students sit in a semi-circle or rows facing a white board with the following passage written on it:

“In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one;” Ephesians 6:16

Simple hand motions are chosen to represent most words in the passage. Students repeat the passage a few times using words and hand motions from memory.

Bible Craft Materials: Construction paper, scissors, markers, tape, safety pins, sample project

As time allows Activity: Shield of Faith Badge

Instructions: Have students sit at tables. Give each student a piece of construction paper and have student cut paper into the shape of a small shield the size of a badge. Have student decorate the shield with a cross and tape a safety pin onto the back so that it can be worn. Discuss the fact that only faith in Jesus Christ and His death on the cross can save a person from the consequences of sin, which is death. (Note: Flaming darts were burning arrows that were meant to destroy wooden shields, leaving a person defenseless against attack and death.)

Practice the armor of God Scripture passage that has been learned to this point: *“Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth and having put on the breastplate of righteousness and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace. In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one...” Ephesians 6:10-11, 14-16*

Closing Have students assist with clean-up.
Remind students to practice their memory work throughout the week.
Close in prayer & dismiss.

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Ephesians 6 "The Armor of God"

Verse 10: "Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might."

Verse 11: "Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil."

Verse 14a: "Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth,"

Verse 15: "and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace."



Verse 16: "In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one;"
